



Line 1 symbolizes the arrow energizing the empirically visible cause. Line 2 symbolizes the arrow energizing the principles applied. Line 3 symbolizes the arrow energizing the effects. Line 4 symbolizes the only reality that is empirically accessible, the arrow that connects the cause (left) with the effect (right). Finally, line 5 represents God, the source of all energizing. The advantage of this reduced sort of pictogram is that it can be scaled down at will, taking only the space of a single letter (A), while still displaying the necessary elements in all imaginable clarity.

4. The context of freedom and maturity God's energization is targeted at helping believers move toward maturity, which is evidenced by an ever-increasing sense of responsibility.

Some of the energy references appear in the context of Paul's teaching on Christian freedom. For Paul, freedom is not just the absence of outer or inner constraints. He doesn't only talk about the enabling of freedom ("free from"), but also and particularly about the active realization of freedom in terms of investment in godly purposes ("free for"). According to the New Testament, freedom from sin, death, law and demonic forces must be expressed in allegiance to Christ and according to the agenda deriving from that allegiance. Such a use of one's freedom is an indicator of maturity, the second major context in which many of the energy references occur. The term used for maturity is *téleios*, in many cases translated as "perfect," which is not really wrong—the word itself, deriving from *télos* (goal, end), actually implies completion and completeness—but can easily be misunderstood in a legalistic ("perfectionist") sense. In many contexts *téleios* is used for a mature adult as opposed to a *paidíon* (infant, little child). In 1 Corinthians 14:20, Paul writes, "Stop thinking like children (*paidía*). In regard to evil be infants, but in your thinking be adults (*téleioi*)." This sort of increasing maturity must not be understood as achieving perfection in the sense of being without sin (compare James 3:2). Paul stresses strongly that he was far from being perfect in that sense: "Not as though I had already attained, either were already perfect (*teteleíomai*): but I follow after, if indeed I may apprehend that for which also I am apprehended of Christ Jesus" (Phil. 3:12). Proceeding on that path implies a process of ongoing growth, and God's energization is the key factor for fueling that process. The close interconnectedness of freedom, maturity, and energization is highly relevant. All three factors are necessary ingredients for the Christian concept of responsibility, which is—while not being a New Testament term—the essence of the New Testament's redefinition of our relationship to the law (as the epitome of institutional orders).⁸² Rather than taking the law as a reference point for evaluating one's actions, Christian responsibility expresses itself in a threefold network of renewed relationships: toward God, toward other people, and toward oneself (Mark 12:30f.). The increasing quality in each of the three areas is an indication that the freedom that has been granted to us is being lived out in a mature way. Since this is a never-ending process, it is nothing less than a definition of the Christian life.

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
